How is it that we have become so consumed with buying more and more things that neither feed nor ultimately satisfy us? Read Isaiah 55:2

Generosity is not just for those gifted to be generous,

At best we can only be obedient couriers, since we own nothing to give.

If we teach people to LIVE generously, we wouldn't have to teach them to GIVE generously.

Jesus' definition of generosity is simple. It's not about the size of the gift,
but rather the amount you still have after the gift is given.

Why do we limit being generous to only those who we deem worthy.
Why not just be generous to everyone, all the time, like Jesus was?

We were created to be GENEROUS. Selfishness smothers our generous nature.

Your degree of generosity is not based upon how much you GIVE,
it is based upon how much you have LEFT OVER after you give.

Generosity solely on my terms is no generosity at all.

Are you a generous giver or an obedient courier?

God has given the gift of generosity to a few so they can serve as lighthouses to show the rest of us the way.
